Updates from NA World Service Conference (WSC):

WSC will be held every 3 years from now on. Our region will select a new RD/RDA after each WSC to match up timing for better continuity in these service positions.

Other countries have growing fellowships while the U.S. fellowship is not really growing.

Investing in Public Relations work seems to be the thing that makes a difference in attracting new members. The Houston Area PR has its own Facebook page which is public facing and is run by their PR subcommittee.

From the RD/RDA team: All GSRs should be attending the annual regional assembly meeting.

Should we put it in CTANA policy that it's required? The regional assembly is held on a Saturday in March every year virtually on Zoom ~10am-2pm. The date is usually



announced at the February RSC, which can be short notice for some folks. I can ask if our region can set a standing date for the regional assembly if that's preferable.

Money matters:

Region has a \$440.93 working balance including prudent reserve. We have a \$2000.00 upcoming expense for the insurance policy that covers all groups in the region. The regional treasury audit should have happened last weekend but we likely won't see results until the next RSC.

TBRCNA 2026:

They made enough money to replenish the seed money used to hold the conference, and the remaining profit was \$866.68. This money was donated back to TBRNA, and a proposal was passed to change how TBRCNA profits are handled. Previously, 50% of profits were immediately donated to NAWS. TBRNA will ensure that seed \$ is available for next year TBRCNA regardless of whether the convention loses money. TBRNA will continue donating 20% of the working balance excluding prudent reserves to NAWS. Both proposals that our area brought to the region were not discussed because the body decided that the issues had already been settled in the past when similar proposals were passed.

Those proposals we brought were:

1) to move all RSC meeting to a fully virtual format until the TBRNA budget had remained in the positive including prudent reserve for at least one calendar year and
2) to *not* buy a second owl conference camera until the TBRNA budget had remained in the positive including prudent reserve for at least one calendar year. I blocked the facilitator's decision to remove proposal 1) from the floor because the proposal was different from the past proposal that he had brought last year for discussion at TBRNA. The straw poll backed the facilitator's decision. So, we'll see what else our region can figure out re: fixing the budget. Any other ideas on how to help our region financially are welcome.

1. Do we want to continue holding our regional convention TBRCNA?
2. Is it providing what we want it to provide to our fellowship?
3. Is it worth the cost and effort required to hold it each year?

Note: Any changes would not take effect until after TBRCNA 2029 because venues are already reserved.

Our area is hosting the next RSC. The RSC will pay at most \$250 for the venue rental. RFATX is booked already for that date, so I have reached out to the Friends Meeting of Austin to see if we can rent their space since it's ideal for hosting a hybrid meeting. Other



venue suggestions are welcome! It's customary for the hosting area to serve lunch. I'd like to request that our area cover up to \$500 for venue and food costs for ~20 people. All are welcome at the service committee meeting, and I will need some helpers on Aug. 8th between 8am-9am for setup, 11am-1pm for serving food, and 5-6:30pm for cleanup. Any volunteers?

Please pay by Money Order, or Cash (Please give cash directly to the facilitator or co-facilitator to allow us to place it in the money box immediately and to verify the amount. Lit Bank opens before Area begins (typically around 1:30 pm), and runs through the opening half of Area.

Once Lit Bank is done processing all the orders, and turns money over to the Treasurer, Lit Bank is then closed - in order for Inventory may be taken. If you have not received your order by the end of Area please come pick up your filled order at the literature.

Our goal is to make Literature available to all groups in addition to simplify Lit Bank operations, therefore we reduced the amount of work to be carried out on the day of Area by 40+% We will only fill orders first half of Area we will typically process the NAWS order on the day of Area (or within a reasonable time frame).

Inventory will be conducted during Area (once money is turned over to the Treasurer). We will not be accepting emergency orders. Any orders which are not in before close of Area will have to wait till the next Area meeting.

Proposal PR to fill up the IP Rack at RFATX was blocked by More will be revealed and they are to write up the block and send out the ASC email for groups to review.

1 Block:

- Per the request at the May 3, 2026, CTANA ASC, the facilitator requested that the block for the following proposal be provided in writing:



- Proposal: PR to fill up the IP Rack at RFATX.
- Reason for Block: Breaking of Tradition 7, which states, "Every NA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."
- Explanation for Block: Eight NA groups meet at this facility. At least several of them donate money to the ASC. The facility is locked while not in use and, therefore, is not a public space while locked. The literature on the rack is either primarily or wholly used by these groups for their meetings to carry the NA message. These eight groups should be responsible for keeping the literature rack filled.
- The first part of the tradition states, " Every NA group ought to be fully self-supporting." "It Works How and Why," states that while a group may need support when starting by other groups, once a group is established:
- "With the evolution of an NA, it's members committed to supporting one another, the group as a whole is ready to take full responsibility for its obligations"
- "Whatever a group needs to fulfill its primary purpose should be provided by the group itself."
- Reason 2 for Block: Not meeting the intent of Tradition 12, which states, "Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all of our traditions., ever reminding us to place principles before personalities"
- Explanation for Block: This proposal provides preferential treatment to the groups meeting at the facility if they are not purchasing their own literature, while all other NA groups do. Maintaining equality between the groups helps foster unity and prevent resentments.
- "It Works How and Why," states that "Our groups do not seek ascendancy over one another: rather, they join and cooperate to work for the greater good of the fellowship as a whole." and that "We are all equal"
- Furthermore, this addict also believes that there are many public locations that PR could place literature racks to help the addict that still suffers, and that a more prudent use could be made of PR's funds, which refers back to the 11th concept.

Kent- Agrees with block, however, in tradition 7, the first group should be fully self supporting, meaning they are not always. He is pointing out that Area can help support a group.
