Hello area,

I hope everyone has had a wonderful month. I would like to say that our Bake-Off Speaker Jam was killer! The message of our area was shared, and I am grateful to be a part of such a beautiful area. We will need an audit after the change of treasurer position. This is within our policy. I will include the policy information below.

5.12 Treasurer:

I. Anytime there is a change in the office of treasurer, an internal audit will be conducted within 30 days by the new Treasurer, the current Facilitator and RCM, and if available as the outgoing Treasurer, Facilitator, or RCM. This audit shall include a review of controls over cash and the appropriateness of receipts and disbursements.

SECTION FOURTEEN - FINANCES AND ACCOUNTING

14.14 An audit of the ASC's financial records should take place at least once a year, when there is a change in the Treasurer, or upon reasonable request from the ASC.

To maintain a productive meeting and a respectful atmosphere during the CTANA Area Service (ASC), I want to call attention to section two of the CTANA Area Service Policy:

J. The Facilitator may implement a time limit on a particular subject with the consent of the ASC.

Questions and Comments:

➤ Kent L. Co-Facilitator Region:

First Suggestion: That the RSC rotation be changed to 3 RSC “All virtual meetings and 1 All in Person” (no virtual or hybrid, location tbd by CBDM at least 2 RSC prior) meeting yearly. As well as any other interim meetings shall be held all virtual (extra car/cat meetings due to ever changing WSC cycles, etc....).

Intent: To improve the quality of online meetings and reduce the cost of the RSC.

Benefits:

All Virtual improves the quality of an online meeting compared to a hybrid. Reduces side talk, low volume of speakers in the back of the room, reduces and or eliminates setting up time for hybrid meetings. Reduces cost to rent a facility suitable for hybrid meetings.

One Regional “All in Person” meeting still allows those of service to meet others from other areas live and in person. Keeping the power of being in person and not eliminating it, those Hugs are of utmost importance to one’s Recovery.

Financial Impact:

Currently the RSC has 14 admin positions with each having travel expenses allowed per policy to an RSC of \$300.00/each. That’s a possible \$4200.00(16800 yearly) for each RSC. To be realistic some admins might live in the hosting Area per rotation and some might not cap out. So, let’s just say half \$2100 x 4 RSC and could be between \$8400.00 to a max of \$16800.00(4 RSC’s) If we just had one in person meeting (possibly held in rotation with Areas with more Admin) Region could reduce expenses by \$6300.00 to \$12600.00. To be more realistic I have asked the Treasurer to provide us with an actual expense of the last few RSC’s.

Tradition and or Concepts that apply.

Concept 11) NA funds are to be used to further our primary purpose and must be managed responsibly.

Concept 1} To fulfill our Fellowship’s primary purpose. The NA groups have joined together to create a structure which develops, coordinates, and maintains services on behalf of NA as a whole.

Second Suggestion: To change the yearly Regional Assembly to an “All Virtual” meeting.

Intent: To improve the quality of Assembly, reduce cost and improve participation of RCM’s and GSR’s to attend(no travel needed).

Benefits:

All Virtual improves the quality of an online meeting compared to a hybrid. Reduces side talk, low volume of speakers in the back of the room, reduces and or eliminates setting up time for hybrid meetings. Reduces cost to rent a facility suitable for hybrid meetings. Increase the participation of RCM’s as well as GSR’s.

Financial Impact:

Currently the RSC has 14 admin positions with each having travel expenses allowed per policy to an Regional Assembly of \$300.00/each. That’s a possible \$4200.00. To be realistic some admins might live in the hosting Area per rotation and some might not cap out. So, let’s just say half \$2100.00. As well as saving Area’s travel expenses that they may pay out to their trusted servants.

Tradition and or Concepts that apply.

Concept 11) NA funds are to be used to further our primary purpose and must be managed responsibly.

Concept 1} To fulfill our Fellowship’s primary purpose. The NA groups have joined together to create a structure which develops, coordinates, and maintains services on behalf of NA as a whole.

My personal experiences:

I would like to relay to those my experiences and thoughts upon making this suggestion. Those that know me well, know that I am a big advocate of “I’m Person” meetings compared to any virtual meeting, in fact in the past I’ve voted against going all “Online” for the Regional Service Conference (RSC).

So, what has led me to make such a suggestion? After being the Regional Treasurer starting in the pandemic (online only) to becoming live in person/hybrid, I was able to see firsthand the financial impact of having to pay out expenses as directed by the Regional Policy. I am currently the Regional Co-Facilitator and I’m still aware to this date of the financial impact of having the RSC live/hybrid. Although I struggle with change. NA has suggested being honest, willing and open-minded. Thus, I find myself open minded to change, changing on the IT level which is honestly a hard one to be willing to accept as I get older. See what I did there! We need to develop with the technology provided to us, to help us better serve the members. So, I ask those of you that have been against online meetings to have an open mind, give it some thought. Like: How should our 7th tradition be managed? Can More members be involved (someone is going to say I don’t have internet access, I will say not all members can travel some have no cars, some have handicaps that keep them from traveling far. You can join online and not be well enough (Sick) to come to an in-person meeting. The list can go on and on. I just want

all of you to think about this one thoroughly. It's not eliminating in-person meetings, rather limiting them to save the fellowship money.

Remember this is to be presented at the August RSC into new business. Per one of the suggestions that came out of the Task Groups after the Regional inventory, by putting any thought of this out as early as possible the RCM's can get them discussed(Not Voted on). This hopefully will allow Area RCM's to bring their Area's voice to the RSC. This hopefully will reduce the time it takes to go back and forth from Region to Area back to Region.n.

- Literature Bank is carrying more of the "Step Working Survival Guide" due to increased demand to avoid groups ordering individually through NAWS and incurring shipping cost printed leaflets, Common Welfare leaflet is available.

Ask Lit Bank - goal: each group collect qty 10 (if wanted)

- No charge

Once these are fully distributed, there is no plan for more.

- LitBank only has ability to distribute, rather than order and/or print

Please announce that the Area Literature Co-Facilitator position will be open at the beginning of the new year.

- Please pay by Money Order, or Cash (Please give cash directly to the facilitator or co-facilitator to allow us to place it in the money box immediately and to verify the amount.
- Lit Bank opens before Area begins (typically around 1:30 pm), and runs through the opening half of Area.
- Once Lit Bank is done processing all the orders, and turns money over to the Treasurer, Lit Bank is then closed - in order for Inventory may be taken.
- If you have not received your order by the end of Area please come pick up your filled order at the literature.

Our goal is to make Literature available to all groups in addition to simplify Lit Bank operations, therefore we reduced the amount of work to be carried out on the day of Area by 30+%

- We will only fill orders first half of Area
- We will typically process the NAWS order on the day of Area (or within a reasonable timeframe).
- Inventory will be conducted during Area (once money is turned over to the Treasurer).
- We will not be accepting emergency orders. Any orders which are not in before close of Area will have to wait till the next Area meeting.
- Our biggest goal is to make literature available to every group seeking it. Please don't hesitate to reach out to myself or Liz and we'll work together to develop a viable solution.

Greetings central tx area na:

We hosted a Valentine’s Day Bake-off & Speaker Jam on February 14, 2026 at Recovery First ATX with 70+ members in attendance. The event successfully fostered unity within the local fellowship. Thanks to our delicious bakers alongside a series of speakers who shared their experience, strength, and hope. Deep gratitude to everyone who contributed and the volunteers who assisted with setup and cleanup and coordination. The atmosphere was one of high engagement and gratitude.

I spent \$88 on the event, which I would like to donate. We collected \$92 in 7th tradition. Effective immediately, I am resigning from my position as Activities Facilitator. While I value the service roles I have taken on the last year (beginning with Outreach/Fellowship Dev 2025) to the Central Texas Area, my current path requires me to prioritize my energetic multidimensional health.
